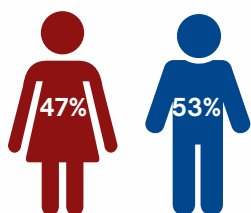

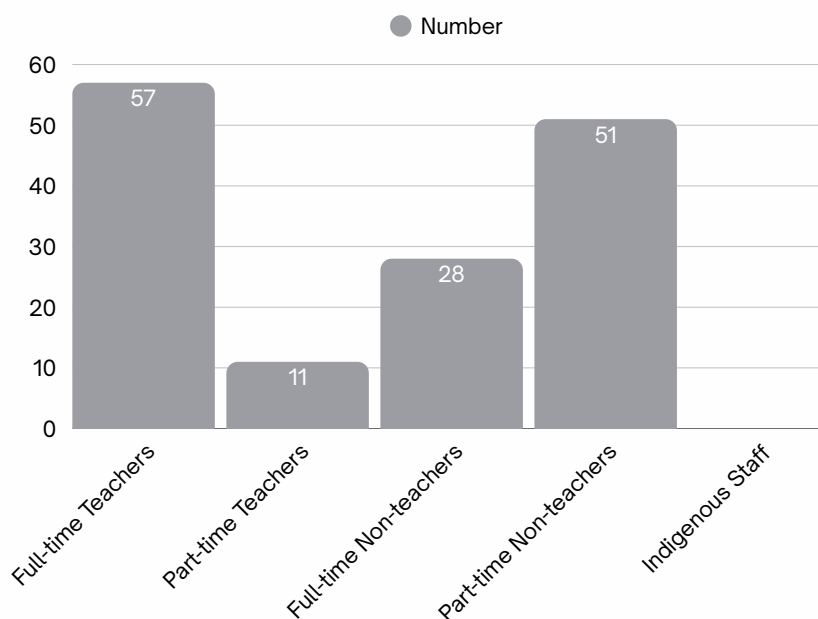

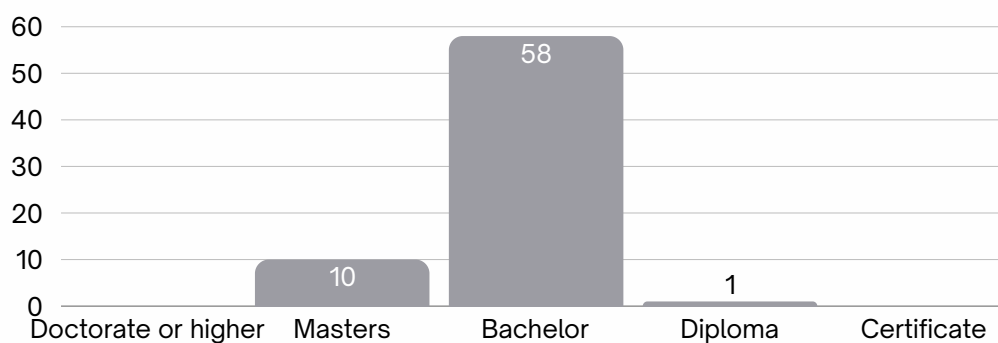
2% of the student population are indigenous. There are 37 different nationalities represented.

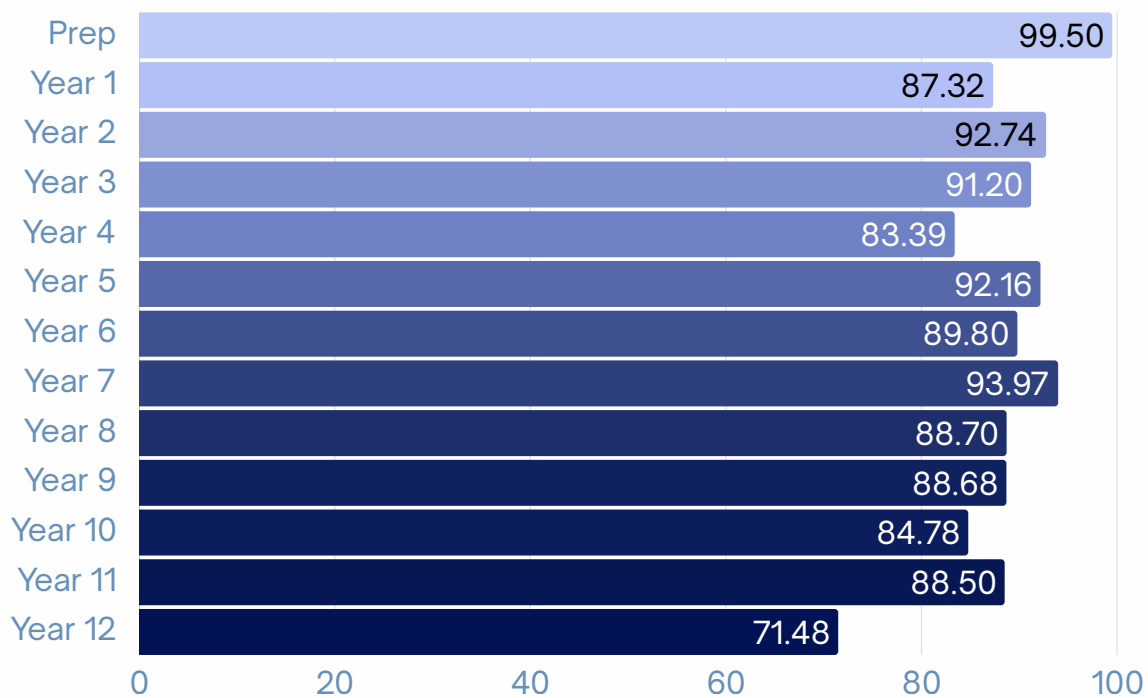
There are many opportunities for students, staff and parents to interact throughout many extra-curricular activities and events. It is the generosity of our parent volunteers who allow us to run additional programs that benefit our students.

Parent, teacher and student satisfaction with the school is reflected in the high retention rates of staff and families. Enrolments have steadily increased throughout the year. Additionally, students and parents are given the opportunity at various stages to provide feedback through surveys focussed on particular events and initiatives.

Student Outcomes

The average student attendance rate for the whole school in 2024 was 89.83%.

A description of how non-attendance is managed by the school:

If a child is unable to attend school, parents are required to inform the College, prior to 8.30am each day, of their child's absence. Parents can use a dedicated email address or the College app to report absences. If the College does not receive notification on the morning of an absence an SMS message is sent to the parent designated mobile phone number.

Accurate student records regarding attendance are recorded on the College's data base. The Student Services team are responsible for collating attendance data. The marking of attendance rolls is a duty of the classroom teacher/tutor and cannot be delegated to students, parents or student teachers. Any unexplained absences are accounted for.
